## Western Red Cedar

### Premium Finger Joint Western Red Cedar

Ideal for use as stain/oil finish vertical and horizontal cladding, battens, screen, fencing and panelling. Manufactured using mid length (0.9 - 1.52m), mixed grain Western Red Cedar blocks, finger jointed into long lengths. Finger joint blocks at each end of a full length board maybe shorter than 0.91m. Finger jointed using premium, structural grade, exterior glue. All product manufacturing (drying, finger jointing, profiling and coating) undertaken in New Zealand. Length specification: Generally 6.1m lengths with a maximum of 10% of the total lineal metre volume as shorter lengths (1.83 - 5.79m). Selected and other lengths available on request. Minimal grade feature removal may be required to meet some end use requirements. Supplied as Combed Face for cladding and panelling and Combed 4 Faces (C4F) for battens, screens and fencing.

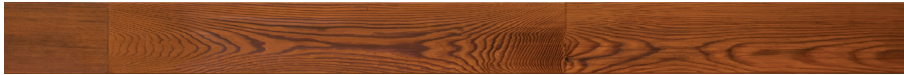

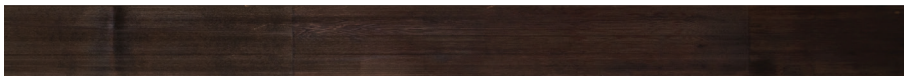

### General Notes

1. In general, a parcel of timber in any grade shall contain a range in quality from the most defective piece permitted in that grade to a piece which just fails to comply with the requirements of the next, higher grade.
2. When timber is visually graded, a reasonable difference of opinion between graders is recognised. However, the provisions of these rules are sufficiently explicit to establish a maximum allowable inclusion of 'Off-Grade' or 'Below Grade' of five percent (5%) in any parcel. This must be regarded as an acceptable, allowable variation.
3. It is advisable for all customers to be familiar with both the requirements of the New Zealand Building Code, those of their local approving authority and the terms under which their Building Consent is granted in regard to profiles, grades and fixing.

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
